MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

The April 8, 2025, Regular Meeting of the City of Chino Legislative Policy Committee was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Mayor Eunice M. Ulloa in the Council Chambers.

Vivian Castro, Deputy City Manager, provided a presentation on the item.

Police Chief Mensen provided a report on the Joint Legislative Audit Committee (JLAC) session concerning the audit process for the California Institution for Men (CIM). Mayor Ulloa asked Chief Mensen to clearly communicate that the City's intention is for the CIM to undergo an audit, not to advocate for its closure, but to ensure the facility operates safely for the surrounding community.

Mayor Ulloa recommended that the CIM consider the sale of a portion of the land to reduce its footprint and allocate the proceeds from the sale towards rehabilitating the facility.

Police Chief Mensen confirmed the CIM tour will take place on May 30, 2025, and Mayor Ulloa confirmed to attend.


Ms. Castro provided updates and announced that Congresswoman Torres would be hosting two community meetings.
