MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

The May 8, 2024, Regular Meeting of the City of Chino Legislative Policy Committee was called to order at 4:01 p.m. p.m. by Mayor Ulloa in the Council Chambers.

DISCUSSION

1. Update on High-Priority Legislative Items. Receive a report. Review and provide direction to staff.

Vivian Castro, Deputy City Manager, provided a presentation on the item.

Jason Gonsolvas, Joe A. Gonsalves & Son, who participated remotely, provided an update on State legislative issues.

Police Lieutenant Aaron Kelliher, presented on Proposition 36.

The Committee took a formal position on Proposition 36, expressing support for the initiative, and directed staff to prepare a letter of support.

The Committee endorsed Council Member Flores' recommendation to consider nominating Commander Michael Huizar, American Legion Post 299, for Assemblymember Rodriguez' District 53 Veteran of the Year Award.

Jackie Melendez, Assistant City Manager, provided information regarding the Entrepreneur Center project.

The Committee discussed the shortage of water treatment facility personnel and the need to work with Chaffey College in developing educational courses for these types of careers.

2. Update on State Legislation. Receive a report on the status of significant State legislation. Review and provide direction to staff.

Vivian Castro, Deputy City Manager, provided a presentation on the item.

The Committee took a formal position on Senate Bill 1037, expressing opposition to the bill, and directed staff to prepare a letter in support.

Mayor Pro Tem Comstock discussed the CalPERS divestment from petroleum-based products harmful to the environment and recommended an opposition position to SB 252.

The Committee opted not to take a position on public safety initiatives determined to have no impact on the City of Chino and staff will update the report accordingly.
