# **NEW BUSINESS**

12. <u>Chino On Ice Winter Wonderland Experience.</u> Approve a contract with Seaside Ice, LLC., dba Ice-America, for the construction, operation and maintenance of a portable outdoor ice-skating rink and associated equipment.

Staff Report By: Silvia Avalos, Director of Community Services, Parks & Recreation and Jackie Melendez, Assistant City Manager

RECOMMENDATION: 1) Approve a contract with Seaside Ice, LLC., dba Ice-America, in the amount of \$446,801 for the construction, operation and maintenance of a portable outdoor ice-skating rink and associated equipment such as lighting and audio-visual effects, 2) approve a cost recovery structure for the program, and 3) authorize the City Manager to execute all necessary documents on behalf of the City.

Silvia Avalos, Director of Community Services, Parks & Recreation, introduced a video to illustrate the ice skating rink program used by other communities.

Jackie Melendez, Assistant City Manager, provided a report on the proposed ice skating rink, which would be placed at the Chino Civic Center southeast parking lot for five weeks starting in the month of December. Assistant City Manager Melendez provided information regarding staff's strategic plans to address the cost recovery, including corporate sponsorship programs and marketing efforts.

Mayor Pro Tem Comstock spoke in support of the proposed ice skating rink and acknowledged staff's efforts to seek unique programs that would be enjoyed by members of the community. She inquired regarding the program cost, sponsorship fees, and revenue generating mechanisms and recommended that if approved staff evaluate the cost and offset revenue amount for the program.

City Manager Reich reported the offset revenue amount is approximately \$35,000.

Council Member Burton stated that although the proposed ice skating rink program sounds like a great community program, he expressed concerns with the program cost and the staff's ability to secure the sponsorships within the current time frame.

Mayor Ulloa shared concerns regarding the project cost and the importance of reserving the City's budget for current city infrastructure improvement projects and wished she could justify support for what could be an excellent offering for the community. She recommended a formal request for proposal process be a requirement for future similar submittals despite it not being a requirement for this particular contract.

Council Member Lucio spoke in favor of community events that bring services and activities to local and neighboring communities, and noted the ice skating rink has the potential to help enhance the Chino downtown business community. He encouraged staff to increase community marketing efforts to help showcase all the amenities Chino has to offer. Council Member Lucio also expressed concern with the program cost, but stated that he has confidence that staff will make this event a success and looks forward to seeing this event grow every year.

Motion by Council Member Lucio, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Comstock.

13. <u>Update on Parking Enforcement for Street Sweeping Purposes.</u> Provide an update on parking enforcement for street sweeping purposes and receive City Council input and direction.

Staff Report By: Dennis Ralls, City Traffic Engineer

RECOMMENDATION: 1) Receive an update on parking enforcement for street sweeping purposes; and 2) provide input and direction to staff.

Dennis Ralls, City Traffic Engineer presented a report on the item. He shared the street sweeping will be phased out with no-parking on street sweeping days on one side of the street per street sweeping day. This will allow residents the option to park on the opposite side of the street and will allow street sweeping to continue at twice a month, with each visit per month allowing for one side to be swept without cars. This was tested in a particular neighborhood and has been successful, with the enforcement starting on September 22, 2023.

Council Member Lucio stated staff's efforts have helped to resolve resident's concerns and believes that this will also help resolve the parking problems in both the College Park and The Preserve communities.

Council Member Burton stated he has received positive comments from residents and believes if staff continues to inform the residents of the street sweeping program he believes it will be a success.

Mayor Pro Tem Comstock thanked staff for addressing the concerns that Council addressed and noted that this will bring many benefits including to help stop debris from falling into the drainage and removal of abandoned vehicles.

Mayor Ulloa inquired if the program will be implemented to the entire community. City Traffic Engineer Ralls stated the program will be completed in phases to the entire community and staff plans to report back to the Council with an update on the progress and for direction when

required.
