

**RESOLUTION NO. 2026-009**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHINO, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE CITY'S ADMINISTRATIVE FINE SCHEDULE AS IT RELATES TO TRUCK ROUTE VIOLATIONS**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Chino has adopted and enforces designated truck routes through its Municipal Code to maintain traffic safety, reduce roadway damage, and minimize the impact of commercial traffic on residential areas; and

**WHEREAS**, per Resolution No. 2022-065 establishing administrative fines for violations of the Chino Municipal Code, adopted by the City Council on October 18, 2022, the current penalty for violating the City's truck route ordinance is a flat fine of \$250 for the first violation, which has proven insufficient in deterring repeat offenders; and

**WHEREAS**, Government Code Sections 53069.4 and 36901 authorize general law cities to impose administrative penalties of up to \$1,000 per violation where violations of the city's municipal code are designated as misdemeanors; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council desires to amend Resolution No. 2022-065 to implement an increase to the escalating fine schedule for repeat truck route violations within 12 months; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed ordinance is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15060(c)(2) and Section 15321 (Enforcement Actions by Regulatory Agencies).

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHINO DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:**

1. The City Council finds that the above recitals are true and correct.
2. The City Council hereby amends Section 1 of Resolution No. 2022-065 establishing administrative fines for violations of the Chino Municipal Code to add an additional category of fines, as it applies to violations of Chapter 10.44 only, to read as follows, with all other provisions of Resolution No. 2022-065 remaining unmodified and in full force and effect:

For violations of Chapter 10.44 of the Chino Municipal Code regarding commercial vehicles and trucks that would otherwise constitute misdemeanors:

<b>First Violation</b>	<b>\$500</b>
<b>Second violation of Chapter 10.44 within one year</b>	<b>\$750</b>
<b>Each additional violation of Chapter 10.44 within one year</b>	<b>\$1000</b>

3. This resolution shall become effective upon adoption.
