Council Member Comstock asked City staff to evaluate renaming Columbus Street to Guardian Way, given the lack of active addresses with Columbus on this street, and to improve visibility and public access to the Chino Police Department.

City Attorney Galante shared that a formal renaming of the street would need to come back for separate City Council consideration and action.

14. Animal Resource Center of the Inland Empire - FY 2024-25 Fund Allocation. Approve the retroactive appropriation for FY 2024-25 of \$2,502,554 to the General Fund for operations and capital costs to the Animal Resource Center of the Inland Empire.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve a retroactive appropriation of \$2,502,554 to the General Fund for operational and capital costs associated with the Animal Resource Center of the Inland Empire for FY 2024-25 and authorized the City Manager to execute all necessary documents on behalf of the City.

Jackie Melendez, Assistant City Manager, provided a report on the item.

Mayor Ulloa inquired regarding when the animals from Chino were transferred to the Animal Resource Center (ARC) facility. Ms. Melendez reported that the animals were transferred prior to July 1, otherwise they would have incurred daily penalties from Inland Valley Humane Society (IVHS).

Maureen Moe Mendoza, spoke to express concerns regarding the ARC facility capacity, surgical capabilities, and veterinary resources, compared to IVHS service offerings and suggested the City partner with IVHS to use the mobile vaccine service.

Council Member Lucio commented that as a member agency, IVHS didn't offer that service

under the City's prior contract, did not allow board meeting attendance, or share financial details, whereas the ARC does offer a public meeting access.

Mayor Ulloa explained the City's decision to leave IVHS was due to rising costs, lack of transparency, and refusal to accept feedback or provide budget details. She acknowledged the ARC facility may not yet meet everyone's expectations but emphasized it is under development. She expressed confidence that the ARC is on a path towards becoming a high quality, community-serving shelter.

Council Member Comstock acknowledged public concerns about the ARC and praised community members for holding leadership accountable. She shared her firsthand experience managing Chino's contract with the IVHS, noting their repeated refusal to provide budget transparency or accommodate service improvement requests. Council Member Comstock pointed out that IVHS had long been the primary provider for West End communities but had gradually failed to keep pace with Chino's growing needs. She encouraged patience through the transition and stressed that the ultimate goal is to support residents and their pets through reliable resources. Council Member Comstock expressed her desire to see ARC and IVHS working together in the future to support each other.

Mayor Pro Tem Burton announced that today marks the official opening of the ARC and reminded everyone that it's currently operating from a temporary location while the permanent facility is being built. He highlighted that the ARC is committed to transparency, with meeting agendas available online and questions always welcome. He encouraged the community to stay patient and optimistic, expressing confidence in the ARC's strong potential once it's fully up and running.

Police Chief's Report

Chief Mensen spoke regarding the Police Department's position on immigration enforcement and full compliance with Senate Bill 54. The Department does not ask individuals about their immigration status, and does not participate in immigration enforcement. The only exception would be responding to assist another law enforcement officer in danger, a situation that has not occurred in Chino. Chief Mensen also reaffirmed his openness to meet with any community member and emphasized the Department's ongoing commitment to community engagement and maintaining strong relationships with the public.
