At the Mayor's request, City Attorney Galante provided an overview of the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) mandates that limit the City's ability to deny projects.

The City Council discussed the State's support of high-density housing and advised residents to bring these concerns to the State representatives representing Chino.

Carl Scholl, provided a public comment noting the project at Cypress/Edison is not part of the affordable housing overlay.

City Attorney Galante explained that content deemed obscene can legally be prohibited, and such restrictions have been upheld when challenged. He confirmed the proposed Ordinance includes those restrictions and Staff noted there is a City approval process for proposed murals.
